Readiness Factors for Family-Educator Partnerships

Families:

- Clarify your role, expectations and accountability
- Be honest about your skills, knowledge and abilities
- Present yourself as a project consultant
- Can you represent the constituency of families
- Model partnership at all levels
- Braid experience with knowledge and skills



Four Tips from Professionals

- Intellect over Emotion (I/E).
- Trust that you matter.
- Cultivate and grow your experience mentor others.
- Communicate effectively consider community-based learning formats.


- Respond vs. React
